## 2020 WILL SEE US CELEBRATING THE 50th ANNIVERSARY of FELTWELL GOLF COURSE



In May 1970 the land that we now enjoy as Feltwell Golf Course began its journey to be converted from a Military Missile Site into a 9 Hole, Par 30 Golf Course.

During November that year the first ball was struck by Wing Commander RL Watson of RAF Marham, who then went on to play a round with John Alce and Rick Rycroft. Unfortunately the picture we have of that first strike is too poor quaity to reproduce, however I have found this picture which shows the three on, I think, the third hole.

As the year goes on more items of the history of the club will be on show in the new display cupboard in the shop.

Events are being planned to celebrate this milestone and we hope some of these will inspire new golfers to come up to Feltwell to play.

Starting on Monday 25th May with an Open Day, we would like as many members as possible to join in, as volunteers, or just to come up on the day to support your club. There will be much to enjoy and take part in and the day will be centered on a theme of Community, Sport and Fitness. We will be inviting all our local sports, fitness clubs and organisations to join in by taking a stand of their own. Posters will be going up shortly in the villages and in the Club.
